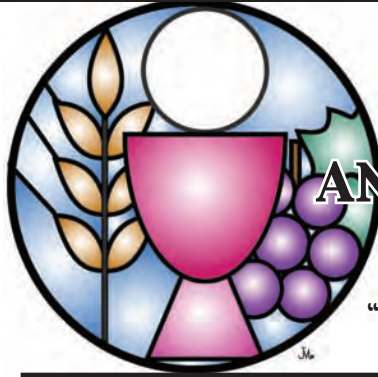

SAINTS AND OBSERVANCES

29 JUN (Wednesday): SAINTS PETER and PAUL

Peter was a Galilean fisherman chosen by Jesus to be His disciple. Jesus changed his name from **Simon** (Hebrew for *he who hears*) to **Peter** (Greek for *rock*). After the Ascension, Peter is described in **Acts** as “chief of the Apostles”. From the middle of the 3rd century onwards, documents show that the Bishops of Rome were recognized as the successors of Peter.



Paul is the “apostle of the Gentiles”. He was born in Tarsus as a Roman citizen, and was raised and educated as a Pharisee. Before his conversion he was a zealous persecutor of Christians. After experiencing the Risen Christ, he became accepted in the Christian community through the intercession of **Barnabas**. It is

believed Paul was martyred for the faith around the year 66.

30 JUN (Thursday): FIRST HOLY MARTYRS OF THE HOLY ROMAN CHURCH (d. ~64)

Christians who were blamed by the Roman Emperor Nero with setting fire to Rome, Italy, and were sentenced to death as punishment. They were all disciples of the Apostles. The total number of these murders is known only to God.

01 JUL (Friday): BLESSED JUNIPERO SERRA, Priest (1713-1784)

A tireless worker, Serra was largely responsible for the foundation and spread of the Church on the West Coast of the United States. Founded twenty-one missions, converted thousands of Native Americans, and trained many of them in European methods of agriculture, cattle husbandry, and crafts. Dedicated religious and missionary, penitent and austere in all areas of his life.

WELCOME, FATHER JOHN MARY CHUNG

Rev. John Mary Chung will be joining Nativity as our new associate, replacing **Fr. Noel**. He was born and raised in a very close-knit family in South Korea. He studied English and English education at Seoul National University (B.A. and M.A.). To further his studies, he came to the United States. He studied theoretical linguistics at the University of California at Berkeley, concentrating on the interface between syntax and semantics in English (M.A. and Ph.D.). He was chair of the Korean program at Smith College in Massachusetts, teaching Korean language, culture and literature, before joining the archdiocese of San Francisco. He attended Blessed John XXIII National Seminary in Weston, Massachusetts (M.Div.). He spent his pastoral ministry year at St. Hilary Parish in Tiburon. His deacon parish was St. John the Baptist Parish in Quincy, Massachusetts. As a deacon, he was privileged to assist the Mass in the Grotto of the Nativity in Bethlehem on Christmas celebrated by the secretary general of the Custody of the Holy Land. He was also privileged to assist the Chrism Mass in St. Peter's basilica on Holy Thursday celebrated by the Holy Father.



Fr. Chung was the first one in his family who was baptized into the Catholic faith when he was 24. Both of his parents are deceased and his mother was Catholic. He has four siblings, who along with their spouses and children, are all practicing Catholics in South Korea. He loves reading and listening to baroque music, Gregorian chant, and medieval polyphony.

As many of you are already aware, this coming **Advent**, throughout the Church in the U.S., several Mass texts will be changed to translate more accurately the Latin text of the Roman Missal. The Mass itself is not changing, only certain texts, and for the congregation there are relatively few new parts to learn. There will be some musical challenges, since many of the melodies we now know, for instance for the *Gloria*, will not fit the new texts, and we will have to learn some new ones. But more importantly, **Archbishop Niederauer** has wisely directed parishes to use the next few months not simply to learn a new script for the liturgy, but to renew and enhance our understanding and appreciation of the Mass itself. It is the source and summit of our lives, and we should always work to deepen our reverence for it. To that end, **Monsignor Otellini** will speak at Masses over the next few weeks to explain the Mass and to introduce the new texts. There will be handouts with the new texts available for parishioners to take home with them to help prepare for the changes. And of course the new missalettes, which are changed annually on the First Sunday of Advent, will also have the new texts. Finally, this is a time of grace to take stock in our personal and community worship – do we actively participate in the responses and the music? do we come on time and stay to the end? do we ponder the words and the actions in our hearts? In the Mass, we die with Christ and we rise with him. We are bonded irrevocably to one another in the one bread and one cup. Any changes in the words do not change this central mystery.

What Does the Catechism Say About . . . *Corpus Christi?*

Chapter 1, Article 3 (The Sacrament of the Eucharist)

sections 1324-1327:

The Eucharist is “the source and summit of the Christian life.” “The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch.” “The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God’s action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit.” Finally, by the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all. In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: “Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking.”

section 1333:

At the heart of the Eucharistic celebration are the bread and wine that, by the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, become Christ’s Body and Blood. Faithful to the Lord’s command the Church continues to do, in his memory and until his glorious return, what he did on the eve of his Passion: “He took bread. . . .” “He took the cup filled with wine. . . .” The signs of bread and wine become, in a way surpassing understanding, the Body and Blood of Christ; they continue also to signify the goodness of creation.
